Mara has a Bachelor's Degree in Medieval Studies from University of California Davis, a Master's Degree in Communications from the University of Wisconsin, and she completed PhD work in Communications from the University of Oregon. During her Doctoral studies, she had an epiphany that she no longer wanted to pursue those studies and went to work for the City of Eugene doing project work. During her tenure at the City, she taught herself basic programming concepts so she could create custom tools to make siloed information more accessible for other City Employees. She realized she enjoyed creating solutions for users' everyday problems from a systems perspective.



After her job ended at the City, she decided to go a completely different direction and enrolled at Lane to study computer programming.
